## How to install your Steel TrussShelf by LoftZone.



## **Inside your Pack**

- One TrussShelf panel to go between each truss
- Two 30mm and two 9.5mm screws for each panel
- One TrussShelf End-Piece for every row of shelves
- Two 30mm screws for each End-Piece


### You will need

- Gloves so as not to catch yourself on the metal parts
- Screwdriver
- Spirit-Level optional the shelves will naturally find their own level, but in case you want to be sure

### Please Note

This product should only be used for domestic storage (max 12kg per shelf), in a well-ventilated attic that is free from condensation. Ensure safe and well-lit access in your attic – lay flooring and do not step on the plasterboard ceiling as it may not hold your weight.


- 1. For each row of shelves, you will need one End-Piece. Starting at the left-hand end of the row of shelves you wish to install, place this so that it rests on the trusses. This naturally determines the height at which your shelving will be. You can screw this in place now, or later, using the longer screws provided.
- 2. Then put the first TrussShelf panel in place. Its left-hand end will rest on the End-Piece and its right-hand end will rest on the trusses. Do not screw it in yet.




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**3.** Place each of the other TrussShelf panels in place, with each panel resting on the previous panel on its left-hand side and on the trusses on its right-hand side.



**4.** When you're happy with the positioning of the shelves, screw them to the trusses through the holes in the lugs, as shown. Use the longer screws provided.



**5.** Finally, screw each panel to the one next to it, through the slot and into the hole beneath, using the shorter screws provided.
